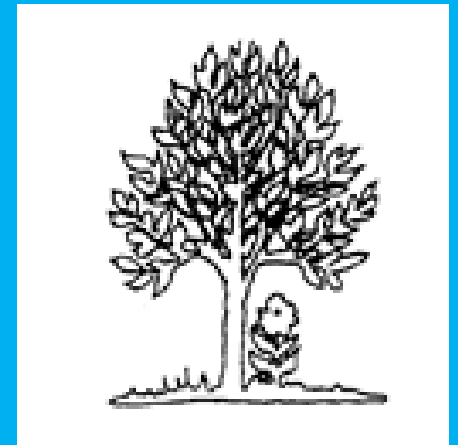

School Uniform

- Northside School Uniform consists of
- Black/grey trousers or shorts of a grey skirt
- White shirt/blouse or polo shirt.
- A school sweatshirt.
- Black sensible school shoes.
- During the Summer, girls may wear blue and white checked dresses.
- Hair accessories should be royal blue and small.
- No jewellery, nail varnish or shaved hair patterns are allowed.

- Homework will often be set from the SATs Practice Workbooks for KS1 English and Mathematics which you can purchase at Parent Consultation Evening
- There will be weekly spellings to learn for a test on Mondays
- Reading – Children have new Orange Reading Records

Home / School Reading

- Please make sure that you complete and sign the Reading Record each day with the title of the book and a comment of how your child read. There is also an opportunity for the children to complete a weekly activity in their reading record based on one of their books.
- Reading books will be changed every Monday and Thursday and your child will continue to read and do comprehension activities with an adult regularly throughout the week

How you can help

- Listen to your child read and talk about the story to support comprehension skills.
- Read stories to them – they need to hear story language.
- Practise counting and writing numbers. Talk about money when you're out shopping.
- Practise telling the time at home and when out shopping.
- Check their book bag everyday for notices.
